Helping to scale wall into China

FOR many South Australian businesses even attempting to reach the market in China remains too hard and too far away.

Adelaide export agent Warwick Prestwood, however, is achieving considerable success for clients.

He relates the story of one company, which had received a file full of overseas inquiries but did not have time to follow them up.

Through his firm, Specialist International Sales Solutions, he has started working for the company with success.

Mr Prestwood started his firm two years ago when he realised there was a major opportunity to represent local companies in export markets.

He has since achieved substantial sales goals, with orders for container-loads of products to China and good sales to other markets.

"The good thing about China is it is an increasingly affluent society looking for more quality products," Mr Prestwood said.

"The opportunities are staggering, as it is a very big market for anything to do with children, pets, automotive and Western fashion."

Recent orders from China include a container-load of coolant from Tectaloy and

several containers of petfood from Imperial Pet Supplies.

Mr Prestwood, who is paid a small retainer plus commission, is a de facto export manager for companies.

"Austrade says its biggest frustration is the number of leads it provides to clients

that they do nothing about," he said. "We provide our clients with an extremely efficient and cost-effective alternative to full-time staff.

The important thing is our clients have to be in it for the long-term and be committed." Mr Prestwood said his

philosophy is if he can help his clients be successful, then he will be successful. He said the South Australian Government office in Shanghai had been "sensational" in helping him achieve sales in China.
